CONDITIONS OF ACCEPTING ARTICLES FOR PUBLICATION in Case Law in Self-Government Cases

The editors accept original articles which directly or indirectly refer to the judgments of bodies of state administration, as well as courts and tribunals in self-government matters. The editors accept commentaries, opinions, discussions and reviews, which apply to the manifestation of problems in the practice of applying self-government law.

The length of the articles should not exceed approximately 30,000 characters with spaces. The articles must have a title, an abstract, headings, a summary, keywords, footnotes prepared in the traditional manner, namely at the bottom of the page, a brief note about the author and the ORCID number and e-mail address for the purposes of the publication. Information should also be provided (in the footnote) about the sources of financing of the given publication, such as national or international grants, grants from foundations, associations or commercial institutions. A bibliography should be attached to the article. The materials for publication should be sent by e-mail to justyna.przedanska@wolterskluwer.com.

By sending the article to the editorial office, the author transfers the exclusive right of publication (copyright and publishing right) to the Publisher. The editors reserve the right to shorten articles, change titles, headings and make substantive and stylistic corrections. The publication of the article is conditional on the prior submission of the signed contract to the Publisher. The Publisher pays the authors royalties for the publication of articles in 'Case Law in Self-Government Cases'.
