AI Policy for KLI Authors

With regard to the use of AI tools and technologies, Kluwer Law International B.V. adheres to the corporate Wolters Kluwer AI Principles (www.wolterskluwer.com/en/about-us/artificial-intelligence-principles).

The following general guidelines on the use of Artificial Intelligence (AI) in the creation of any work to be published by Kluwer Law International B.V. apply:

- The use of AI and AI-assisted technologies (hereafter referred to as AI) is permitted during the pre-writing and research phase. However, please be aware that AI systems can generate inaccurate or misleading information ("hallucinations"). Authors must therefore verify all research findings and validate their sources.
- The use of AI during the writing process is permitted only for improving readability and language. Where AI is used, authors should work within a secure, professionally managed, or otherwise approved AI environment. Authors must not use open or public AI tools where submitted content may be used for model training, service improvement, or other purposes beyond the author's control.
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- The use of AI may not replace the author's intellectual contribution, including reasoning, analysis, recommendations, conclusions, or other original thought.
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
