Midwives, physicians, clinicians, researchers, and students can search more than 300,000 bibliographic references to articles from over 400 different sources, including journals, books, reports, guidelines, government publications, and more. Each bibliographic reference in the Maternity and Infant Care database includes an abstract, is assigned keywords and categorised by type and format to enhance searching. Approximately 1,000 new records are added each month.

Produced by the MIDIRS team of information specialists, the database is international in scope and spans a wide range of subject areas, including:
