CONDITIONS FOR ACCEPTING ARTICLES FOR PUBLICATION in Territorial Self-Government

The editors accept original articles of a length of 25,000-40,000 characters with spaces, including footnotes, with a clearly marked title, a split into sub-chapters, a summary, footnotes, a brief note about the author and his e-mail address. Longer or shorter materials, or materials that have already been published require separate consent from the Editor-in-Chief. The requirements as to the amount of text do not apply to discussions, commentaries, reports, reviews etc. The article should include an abstract of no more than 1.200 characters, as well as keywords. The author should provide his ORCID number and e-mail address for publication purposes. Footnotes should be prepared in the traditional manner – at the bottom of the page. A list of the literature used in the article (bibliography) is required and information on the sources of financing must be provided (for instance, if the article is a result of a grant) and, in the case of co-authorship, the percentage contribution of the individual people into the publication must be given. We would ask that the materials with the author's details (position, address, telephone number) and possibly letter of reference are sent by e-mail or traditional post with an attached CD. By sending the article to the editorial office, the author transfers the exclusive right of publication to the Publisher. We do not print articles of a descriptive nature which have no research aspect or new cognitively interesting content. The author is responsible for the correct application of the current legal status, case law and legal doctrine in his article. The editors reserve the right to shorten articles, change titles and headings and make substantive and stylistic corrections. The publication of the article is conditional on the prior submission of the signed contract to the Publisher. Royalties are not paid for publications in 'Territorial Self-Government'.
